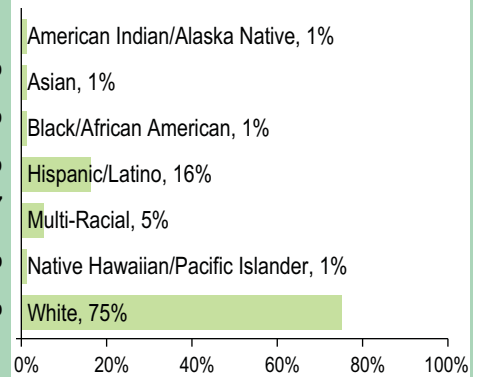

Percent of students with all required vaccines: 97 (Visit www.healthoregon.org/immdata for more information.)

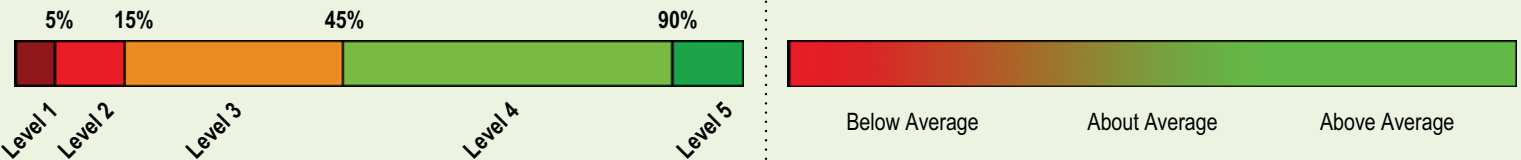
